# Type of Funding

- **Capacity Building:** creating more higher quality and/or more sustainable services (research, assessment, expansion, resource development, organizational development, etc.)
- **General Operating support:** day-to-day costs of running your organization (office space, staff salaries, marketing materials, etc.)
- Program/Project support: a specific project/program within your organization

### **Outcomes**

Outcomes are the observable results of programs that are created and funded in hopes of making a difference in the world. What is the work trying to accomplish? ### **Performance Measures**

Please provide which data/information will be collected and how (surveys, test scores, media attention, awards, longitudinal studies, etc.).

#### Goals

High level statements that provide overall context for what the program is trying to achieve and should be measurable statements of activities proposed in the grant request.

# Goals can be listed as outputs.

Outputs -Direct products of the activities proposed - usually measured in terms of volume of work accomplished – for example, number of people served.

# Examples:

Goals without baseline data:

- 1. To serve 1,300 people in 2024.
- 2. To raise \$100,000 in additional funding by 12/31/2024.

## Goals with baseline data:

- 1. To increase the number of children and adults served from 1,300 to 1,600 by 12/31/2024.
- 2. To increase the number of courses offered per year from 5 to 10 by 12/31/2024.
- 3. At least X% of participants diagnosed with depression will show a Y% or better improvement in their test scores at 6 month follow up.
